

Halloween Safety Tips: ALL Dressed Up

Plan costumes that are bright and reflective. Make sure that the shoes fit well and that costumes are short enough to prevent tripping, entanglement or contact with flame.

Because masks can limit or block eyesight, consider non-toxic makeup and decorative hats as safer alternatives. Hats should fit properly to prevent them from sliding over eyes.

When shopping for costumes, wigs and accessories look for and purchase those with a label clearly indicating they are flame resistant.

If a sword, cane, or stick is a part of your child's costume, make sure it is not sharp or too long. A child may easily be hurt if he stumbles or trips.

Obtain flashlights with fresh batteries for all children and their escorts.

Teach children how to dial 9 -1 -1 if they have an emergency or become lost.

Emergency Cards. Please help us contact you when extremely necessary by updating your emergency cards. It is most helpful at this time to know your current phone numbers and updated authorized pick-up list. Thank you!

Tuition Fees. Monthly tuition fees are due on the first of each month. Late fees of \$24 applies after the 10th of

Sign In and Out Daily. It is mandatory for all parents/guardians to sign their child in and out daily with their full legal signatures. Children may not sign in behalf of their parents.

Charter Oak Gymnastics. Every Monday from 12 - 12:45pm. Cost is \$7.59/class for six week sessions.


Music and Kids - Mondays from 3 - 3:30 pm. & 3:30 to 4. 4 sessions a month for \$44.
